

REQUIREMENTS FOR PERMANENT RESIDENT VISA (RESIDENCIA PERMANENTE)

Appointment is not required for this process. Applications are received in person Monday through Friday between 9:00AM to 1:00 pm.

- 1) Complete a Visa application
- 2) Valid passport (and copy of the first page)
- 3) One passport photo.
- 4) Original and copy of the migratory document proving your legal migratory status in USA (I-797, I-20 advance parole, etc.), only for applicants who are not USA citizens.
- 5) Proof of economic solvency original and copy:
 - a) Last 6 months of banks statements; (assets that received from your pension of at least \$2,500 a month).
 - b) Pension Receipts from Social Security. For the last six months.
 - c) Last 12 months of proof of investment account(s) in U.S.A. Amount of balance every month \$110,000.

*If you have property in Mexico (please bring a copy of the deed showing the value of the property).

*If you are married bring your married certificate original and copy.

*Payment of visa fee: \$36.00 US dollars (we accept cash, debit card and credit card)

*Everyone who requires a visa, regardless of age needs to apply in person.

*Processing time is up to 5 business days.

*The issuance of the visa is subject to the consular interview.

* The Consulate General of Mexico reserves its right to request further information if deemed necessary.

*These requirements are subject to change without warning

PLEASE BE ADVISED: This process must be completed at the Instituto Nacional de Migración (INM). After entering into Mexico, REMEMBER you have only 30 days to appear at the nearest immigration office (INM), with your passport, visa and FMM in order to obtain your resident card for which you will have to cover a fee.

Visitors with **resident visa must** obtain a card (FMM form) from the airline or at any port of entry into Mexico and complete this form with his/her individual information. The immigration officer will stamp the FMM card upon arrival. PLEASE KEEP IT IN A SAFE PLACE AND DO NOT LOSE IT.

The Mexican migratory authorities have the faculty to grant or deny the entry into Mexico if the visitor does not fully comply with the migratory regulations.
